School Day

Doors open at 8.40am

Registration takes place at 8.45am

School ends at 3.15pm

Dismissal Procedures

Dismissal at the end of the day will be from the classroom door. Children will only be handed over to a known adult. If you require another adult to collect your child at the end of the day a verbal communication at the classroom will suffice or communication via the school office. However, school cannot accept the say so of another child's parent and your child will not be handed over. NB a password may be required from any adult not known to the school.

Please be reminded that you are responsible for your children before 8.40am/handover and also after 3.15pm/pick up from school. Children need to be supervised by parents/carers at all times. Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment before or after school. If an older sibling is due to collect a member of Year 2 then the signed permission form (permission to walk home) must be completed and a message must be sent via dojo to inform the class teacher.

Attendance & Punctuality

Termly acknowledgements regarding attendance will continue to be issued this year. 97% is our school target. It is important that your child arrives to school on time, as learning starts the moment they step foot in the classroom! If your child is late or needs to be collected for an appointment you will be required to use the electronic signing in/out system located by the school office. If your child's attendance falls below 90% they are classed as a "Persistent Absentee". Attendance concerns are addressed each half term and parents/carers will be notified in writing of this. Please be reminded that request for holidays in term time will not be authorised and it is school policy to issue a local authority fine if the child has 5 days or 10 sessions missed for unauthorised reasons. Any request for "special leave" (extenuating circumstances) must be made on the orange form which can be collected from the school office.

Behaviour

This year the children will continue to receive 'Dojo' points for their behaviour and fabulous work. This system has been a great success over the last few years as both a way of celebrating successes and communicating with parents. I will be available each morning or at the end of the day but if unavailable please feel free to contact me via the Dojo system and I will respond at my earliest convenience. Dojo is great for minor queries, however, if you have anything that you feel needs discussing in more detail, please contact me via my school email (dparr.vps@schools.sefton.gov.uk) and/or make an appointment to meet at a suitable time. Please be aware that messages in the evenings and at weekends will not be routinely monitored. Please be reminded that all urgent queries in the school day should go through the office.

Uniform

Please ensure your child comes to school in the correct Valewood uniform. Nail varnish, makeup and jewellery are not permitted to be worn in school. Small stud earrings and a small analogue watch are permitted but smart watches are not allowed. Please ensure ALL uniform is named. *Junior children who attend swimming lessons must do so without any earrings. Staff are unable to take out/put in earrings. This is Crosby Pool's policy and must be adhered to.

Curriculum

The children will continue to receive a broad and balanced curriculum. Termly curriculum guides will show the focus for each subject that will be taught throughout each term. Learning will be periodically revisited throughout the year. Check out the school website or class dojo for information regarding the Year 2 curriculum.

At Valewood our reading scheme is centred around the Oxford Reading Tree scheme. The children follow the Floppy's Phonics scheme and access to these resources can be found at the Oxford Owl website.

School excursions and learning outside the classroom (eg Forest School) are important elements of our school curriculum and parents/carers are welcome to support these days providing you have a current school volunteer DBS. Please contact the school office to apply. All volunteers must agree to the School's Volunteer Code of Conduct.

Online Safety

Teaching online safety is an integral part of our curriculum and is referenced in all subjects. Children's use of technology is carefully planned for throughout the week and all school devices are protected by our school firewall.

Use of Technology at Home

Children's access and use of technology and social media at home is the responsibility of the parents/carers. Issues arising from inappropriate use of social media outside of the school day will not be dealt with by school staff.

Learning at Home

Home Reading

Regular home reading gives children an opportunity to practise skills and encourages a love of reading in leisure time. In Year 2, the children will read through whole class reading sessions or 1:1 sessions. Please encourage your child to read every day at home (or at least 4/5 times a week for 10/15 minutes) as it is proven that home reading has a big impact on a child's reading fluency and accuracy. Please ensure you make a record of your child's reading at home as reading records will be monitored. Children should bring their book bags to school every day and will be kept in their locker. Reading books can be changed on any day and is the responsibility of the child. Oxford Owl is also a wonderful resource for children to use to access Floppy's Phonics resources and read additional banded books. If you feel that your child is ready to move up a band/level please dojo me and a review of their reading will take place.

Reading Raffle

In Year 2 I run a Reading Raffle. If your child reads for 4/5 times a week (or more) they will be entered into the raffle. Every raffle participant will receive 3 dojos and a chance to win a book from my special selection. All you need to do is sign to show that they have read the expected amount. This can be completed after every read or once a week stating they have read 4/5 times.

Spellings

Year 2 spellings will be set every Friday to be practised at home in their spelling books. Spelling games/activities will also be available via our app – The Spelling Shed linked to the week's focus words. Each child will be issued with a login for the website/app where they will be able to practice relevant spellings for their age.

Maths

Year 2 will be set an online Maths task through maths.co.uk. They will also be able to access additional Maths practise activities through Maths Shed and Times Tables Rockstars.

P.E.

P.E. will usually take place twice a week but sometimes this has to be changed, so please can children have their kits (shorts, t-shirt, spare socks and pumps/trainers, plain tracksuit in cold weather) in school every day. Please name all kit. P.E. kits will be sent home after the last PE lesson of the week, to be washed and need to be returned by the following week. Please note that the children will require their PE kits every **Monday** and every **Tuesday**. If your child fails to bring in a PE kit, you will be reminded that PE is part of the school curriculum and we will provide spare kit so that your child does not miss their lesson.

The Daily Mile/Daily Skip

This year we will undertake the 'Daily Mile' or 'Daily Skip' initiative encouraging all members of the Valewood community to be more active. The 'Mile' is not about running fast and winning a race but instead is about developing stamina and promoting healthy lifestyles – healthy minds and healthy bodies.

Free School Meals

Every child in Year 2 is eligible to receive a free school meal, under the government's initiative. We encourage you to take up this offer. If you believe you are eligible for free school meals, linked to your income, it is important that you apply for this as it provides additional funding for your child in school (the form for this application can be collected from the school office). If your child decides to bring a packed lunch then they can bring their lunch in an appropriate lunch box which will be kept in their locker.

Snacks, Tuck Shop and Water Bottles

Children are allowed to bring a sensible snack from home to consume at morning play time. Fruit and healthy snacks are encouraged. Alternatively, the children can purchase a snack from the class tuck shop at the cost of 40p. If your child requires a tuck shop snack everyday please send them into school with £2.00 or they can bring 40p each day however they will need the exact money as no change can be given. The children are encouraged to bring in a water bottle every day, however, please ensure that it is a suitable size. Over-sized expensive water bottles are not acceptable.

Birthday Treats

If your child would like to bring in a birthday treat to celebrate their special day then only individually wrapped treats are allowed. They must be given to one of the adults in class (no treats will be accepted via the office) who will place the treats in a safe place and supervise the distribution of the treats at the end of the day.

Bikes and Scooters

We encourage families to walk to school and park away from Sherwood Ave and Sherwood Rd. If you do need to park then please park respectfully and do not park across our neighbours' driveways. Please remind your children that scooters/bicycles etc should not be used on school property and should be locked in the bike sheds. A bicycle/scooter agreement should be completed before your child comes to school on their bike/scooter.

REMINDERS

- Please help us to make sure that your child does not lose any of their clothing by naming all items.
- Please ensure that your child arrives at school with all the necessary equipment they need to minimise disruptions to learning.

We are looking forward to teaching and supporting your child in Year 2, here's to a fantastic year ahead!
