


Year 2 Geography Knowledge Organiser – Fieldwork and Map Skills

Selected Vocabulary and Definitions	
Country	An area of land with a defined edge
Continent	A large solid area of land made up of countries
Ocean	A very large expanse of sea
Landmark	An object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognised.
Map	Representation of an area of land or sea showing different features
Symbol	An object or picture that represents something else

Curriculum Objectives
To use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied.
To use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
To use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.
To use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of my school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.


