Please feel free to pass on any information to the above staff. There is always someone available at the beginning and at the end of every day.

### School Day

Doors open at 8.40am

Registration takes place at 8.45am

School ends at 3.15pm

### Dismissal Procedures

Dismissal at the end of the day will be from the classroom door. Children will only be handed over to a known adult. If you require another adult to collect your child at the end of the day a verbal communication at the classroom will suffice or communication via the school office. However, school cannot accept the say so of another child’s parent and your child will not be handed over. NB a password may be required from any adult not known to the school.

Please be reminded that you are responsible for your children before 8.40am/handover and also after 3.15pm/pick up from school. Children need to be supervised by parents/carers at all times. **Please be reminded that children are not allowed on the playground equipment before or after school. Please promptly leave the school grounds at the end of the day.**

If your child has permission to walk home by themselves then the signed permission form must be completed. If your child requires a mobile phone to be brought to school, the permission letter must be signed and phones are stored in the school office during the day. **Please note, mobile phones are not permitted to be used by the children on the school grounds.**

### Attendance & Punctuality

Termly acknowledgements regarding attendance will continue to be issued this year. 97% is our school target. It is important that your child arrives to school on time, as learning starts the moment they step foot in the classroom! If your child is late or needs to be collected for an appointment you will be required to use the electronic signing in/out system located by the school office. If your child’s attendance falls below 90% then they are classed as a “Persistent Absentee”. Attendance concerns are addressed each half term and parents/carers will be notified in writing of this. Please be reminded that request for holidays in term time will not be authorised and it is school policy to issue a local authority fine if the child has 5 days or 10 sessions missed for unauthorised reasons. Any request for “special leave” (extenuating circumstances) must be made on the orange form which can be collected from the school office.

## **Behaviour**

This year the children will continue to receive 'Dojo' points for their behaviour and fabulous work. This system has been a great success over the last few years as both a way of celebrating successes and communicating with parents. The Year 6 team will be available at the end of the day but - if unavailable - please feel free to contact us via the Dojo system and we will respond at our earliest convenience. Dojo is great for minor queries, however, if you have anything that you feel needs discussing in more detail, please contact us via our school emails ([rburns.vps@schools.sefton.gov.uk](mailto:rburns.vps@schools.sefton.gov.uk) or [hclark.vps@schools.sefton.gov.uk](mailto:hclark.vps@schools.sefton.gov.uk)) and/or make an appointment to meet at a suitable time. Please be aware that messages in the evenings and at weekends will not be routinely monitored. **Please be reminded that all urgent queries in the school day should go through the office.**

## **Uniform**

Please ensure your child comes to school in the correct Valewood uniform. Nail varnish, makeup and jewellery are not permitted to be worn in school. Small stud earrings and a small analogue watch are permitted but smart watches are not allowed. Please ensure ALL uniform is named. \*Junior children who attend swimming lessons or competitions must do so without any earrings. Staff are unable to take out/put in earrings. This is Crosby Pool's policy and must be adhered to.

## **Curriculum**

The children will continue to receive a broad and balanced curriculum. Termly curriculum guides will show the focus for each subject that will be taught throughout each term. Learning will be periodically revisited throughout the year. Check out the school website or class dojo for information regarding the Year 6 curriculum.

School excursions and learning outside the classroom (e.g. Forest School) are important elements of our school curriculum and parents/carers are welcome to support these days providing you have a current school volunteer DBS. Please contact the school office to apply. All volunteers must agree to the School's Volunteer Code of Conduct. This is also required for transporting to and from sporting competitions.

## **Online Safety**

Teaching online safety is an integral part of our curriculum and is referenced in all subjects. Children's use of technology is carefully planned for throughout the week and all school devices are protected by our school firewall.

## Use of Technology at Home

Children's access and use of technology and social media at home is the responsibility of the parents/carers. Issues arising from inappropriate use of social media outside of the school day will not be dealt with by school staff. **\*A reminder that social media apps usually have age ratings of 13+ and are not designed for children to use. Please monitor their online activity carefully if you allow your child to use them.**

## Learning at Home

### **Home Reading**

Regular home reading gives children an opportunity to practise skills and encourages a love of reading in leisure time. In Year 6, the children will read through whole class reading sessions or 1:1 sessions. Please encourage your child to read every day at home (or at least 5 times a week for 15 minutes) as it is proven that home reading has a big impact on a child's reading fluency and accuracy.

### **Spellings**

Year 6 spellings will be set every Monday to be practised at home in their purple spelling book, ready for a spelling quiz each Friday. The children are expected to practise these spellings each night as a little and often approach always works best for learning spelling rules.

### **English**

Year 6 will be given a login for Read Theory – an online comprehension programme. It is expected that children will complete 30 minutes per week on this programme. Mrs O'Hara may also set chapters/pages of the class novel to read for the following day and this will be communicated both to the children and on Dojo.

### **Maths**

Year 6 will be set a weekly maths activity through maths.co.uk every Monday to be completed for the following Monday. They will also continue to have logins for Times Table Rockstars. **Times tables are an essential part of the upper junior maths curriculum, so as much practise as possible is a great way for the children to become quicker and more fluent in maths.**

**It is expected that every child completes the above homework tasks.**

### P.E.

P.E. will usually take place twice a week but sometimes this has to be changed, so please can the children have their kits (shorts, t-shirt, spare socks and pumps/trainers, plain tracksuit in cold weather) in school every day. Please name all kit. P.E. kits will be sent home after the last PE lesson of the week, to be washed and need to be returned by the following week. PE days and changes will be communicated via Dojo. **If your child fails to bring in a PE kit, you will be reminded that PE is part of the school curriculum and we will provide spare kit so that your child does not miss their lesson.**

### **Daily sports activities**

This year we will undertake additional short, daily sport activities where possible to keep encouraging the children to keep active, promote healthy lifestyles, healthy minds and healthy bodies.

### **Snacks, Tuck Shop and Water Bottles**

Children are allowed to bring a sensible snack from home to consume at morning play time. Fruit and healthy snacks are encouraged. Alternatively, the children can purchase a snack from the class tuck shop at the cost of 40p. If your child requires a tuck shop snack everyday then please send them into school with £2.00 or they can bring 40p each day; they will however need the exact money as no change can be given. The children are encouraged to bring in a water bottle every day, however, please ensure that it is a suitable size. Over-sized expensive water bottles are not acceptable.

### **Birthday Treats**

If your child would like to bring in a birthday treat to celebrate their special day then only individually wrapped treats are allowed. They must be given to one of the adults in class (no treats will be accepted via the office) who will place the treats in a safe place and supervise the distribution of the treats at the end of the day.

### **Bikes and Scooters**

We encourage families to walk to school and park away from Sherwood Ave and Sherwood Rd. If you do need to park then please park respectfully and do not park across our neighbours' driveways. Please remind your children that scooters/bicycles etc should not be used on school property and should be locked in the bike sheds. A bicycle/scooter agreement should be completed before your child comes to school on their bike/scooter.

### **REMINDERS**

- Please help us to make sure that your child does not lose any of their clothing by naming all items.
- Please ensure that your child arrives at school with all the necessary equipment they need to minimise disruptions to learning.

We are looking forward to teaching and supporting your child in Year 6; here's to a fantastic year ahead!
